Notification of major gas works: A205 / Brownhill Road, Catford

I am writing to make you aware of our forthcoming upgrade of our gas network in A205 (Brownhill Road), Catford. This essential work involves the replacement of old metal gas mains with new plastic pipe to ensure we continue to provide a safe and reliable gas supply to the local area. Our contractor Forefront Utilities will undertake this work on our behalf.

So that we can minimise disruption, we have carefully consulted and planned our work in partnership with London Borough of Lewisham and Transport for London and we will start our project on **Monday 16 September**.

Over the coming 12 weeks, we will be upgrading our network on A205 (Brownhill Road) from the junctions of Laleham Road and progressing westwards towards A21 (Rushey Green). To ensure everyone's safety, we need to install temporary traffic lights in place around our work area which will move with us as we progress along the Brownhill Road towards the junction with Plassy Road.

Whilst we are working at the junctions with Laleham Road, Jutland Road and Bowness Road, we will need to temporarily close the side roads with the A205 (Brownhill Road). Pedestrian access will be maintained, and signed diversions will be in place for motorists.

When we reach the junction with Plassy Road traffic flow will be maintained, however due to the location and being a large diameter main we will need to reduce the A205 westbound to one lane.

Our engineers will continue to progress along Brownhill Road working between Plassy Road and A21 (Rushey Green). For everyone's continued safety, we'll need to reduce the A205 (Brownhill Road) eastbound to one lane.

We're continuing to plan further phases of our work in consultation with London Borough of Lewisham and Transport for London. We'll provide details of our plans once confirmed.

We understand that people can get frustrated by roadworks. However, the new plastic pipe has a minimum lifespan of 80 years. This means that when the work is complete, Catford businesses and residents will continue to enjoy the benefits of a safe and reliable gas supply for years to come.
